What Research Tutorials (HNR 325) are offered?	There are usually two Honors Research Tutorials in the course schedule each semester. Topics vary and are based on the current research interests of the JWHC faculty. At the beginning of each registration season, students will receive an email with course descriptions for the tutorials and may select the one that looks most interesting to them. Research Tutorials are capped at 10 students.		
I've heard that Honors Forum fulfills the General Education Fine Arts requirement (MUS 180). How does this work?	Four semesters of Honors Forum on Faith & the Arts (HNR 101-104) fulfills the Gen. Ed. Fine Arts requirement. Each of the one-credit courses covers a different period of history. John Wesley Scholars must take all four courses to complete the Fine Arts requirement.	If Mary C. Dodd Honors Students have not already taken MUS 180, they may enroll in the foursemester sequence of Honors Forum on Faith & the Arts (HNR 101-104) to complete both their General Education Fine Arts and Honors Forum requirements. If students have already completed MUS 180, they may still take the four-semester sequence of Honors Forum on Faith and the Arts (HNR 101-104) to complete their Honors Forum requirement. Or they may take four semesters of HNR 200 Honors Forum on Christ & Culture.	
Why would I enroll in HNR 200 (Honors Forum on Christ & Culture) for 1 hour versus 0 hour?	Students may enroll in HNR 200 for either 0 or 1 hour. The course experience and assignments are the same in either case. Typically, students only enroll in HNR 200 for 0 hour if the course would otherwise cause them to exceed 16 credit hours in a given semester.		
I'm an HST/SOS/SSE major and not required to take HST 180. How does this impact my Honors coursework?	Because HST/SOS/SSE majors enroll in HST 185-186 instead of HST 180, they are not required to take HST 180 HC. If they do not enroll in HST 180 HC, these students will complete 9 hours of Honors Electives (rather than 6 hours).	HST 180 HC is not a required course for Mary C. Dodd Honors Students.	
Why would I register for 1 hour versus 0 hour for HNR 499 (Honors Scholarship Presentation)?	Students typically enroll in HNR 499 as a 0 hour course. If students choose to submit their scholarship for publication in an undergraduate research journal or presentation at an off-campus conference, in addition to the required on-campus scholarship presentation, then they would enroll in HNR 499 as a 1 hour course.		
How many credit hours may I take each semester?	Students may take up to 18 hours each semester. JWHC students may request a 17 th Hour Credit Exemption, meaning that the fee for their 17 th credit will be waived. JWHC students may receive this exemption for up to 4 semesters. Watch for an email at the beginning of each semester and complete the appropriate form to receive this exemption.		
am planning to study abroad. How will this mpact my honors coursework?	The JWHC strongly encourages its students to study abroad during their collegiate experience and will work with students to accommodate such opportunities within the curriculum. Students may count at least 3 credit hours of their study abroad toward honors requirements. Depending on the study abroad program, students may also be able to fulfill part of their Honors Forum and/or Liberal Learning Tutorial requirements during their semester abroad.
