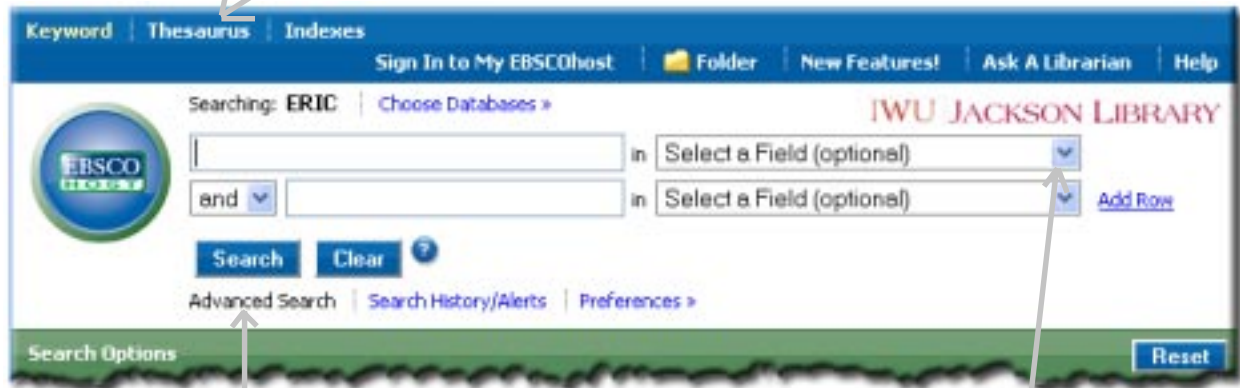


# IWU Library ERIC Database Guide








The Educational Resource Information Center, contains more than 1.2 million citations going back to 1966, with more than 340,000 full-text non-journal documents.

Use the **Thesaurus** to browse key subject terms. The Thesaurus allows for subject guided searching.



Click **Advanced Search** to set search limiters such as Journal Name, Date Published, Journal or Document.



Click here to limit search terms to author, title, etc.

ERIC Journals (EJs) may have a link to **PDF Full Text** which utilizes other EBSCO full text database journals.

The Jackson Library maintains over 200,000 ERIC Documents (EDs) in microfiche to the north of the Reference Desk. EDs after 2004 usually have a link to **Full Text from ERIC**.

## What to do when you find a citation without full text

Select  **Check the Journal Title Search** to see if the Library provides access in some other format or database. With access to 31,000+ titles in over 100 databases, your article may be available in full text from another source. If items are not available, you can click on  to request items from Interlibrary Loan.

## When printing PDFs, use the control bar for Acrobat, not the Internet browser.
