

The Bachelor to Doctor of Nursing Practice Family Nurse Practitioner program at Indiana Wesleyan University seeks to prepare the program graduate for licensure/certification and service in the Family Nurse Practitioner profession. Licensure/certification procedures vary by state. The procedure in the states for which the IWU curriculum meets educational requirements is:

Following successful program completion, graduates are eligible to sit for certification with the American Association of Nurse Practitioners (https://www.aanp.org/studentresources/np-certification) or the American Nurses Credentialing Center (https://www.nursingworld.org/ancc/). After passing the certification exam, the graduate may apply for licensure to practice as a Nurse Practitioner by contacting their state board of nursing.
