

The Marriage and Family Therapy program at Indiana Wesleyan University seeks to prepare the program graduate for licensure/certification and service in the marriage and family therapy profession. Licensure/certification procedures vary by state. The <u>American Association of Marriage and Family Therapy</u> (AAMFT) has collected the licensure processes for each of the states. The procedure in the state of Indiana is:

Following successful completion of the IWU MFT program, the program graduate achieves Indiana state licensure by the following steps.

- Completion of the education and internship requirements for the MFT Associate license.
- Passed the exam approved by the board.
- Completion of two years of post-degree clinical experience as an MFT.
 - A minimum of 1,000 hours of client contact
 - Half of the clients must be receiving marriage and family therapy services.
 - Must be supervised under a board-approved supervisor.
 - Completion of 200 hours of direct supervision, 100 of which must be individual.
