The speaker for this year's *Faith and Learning Luncheon* will be Elizabeth R. Schiltz. Professor Schiltz is an Associate Professor at the University of St. Thomas, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Saint Paul Seminary, and the Co-Director of the Terrence J. Murphy Institute for Catholic Thought, Law, and Public Policy. She is trained in law with an emphasis on banking regulation, general corporate law, and international law.
