

HNR 100 A: Honors Forum on Christ & Culture

Course Description

The purpose of this course is to expose students to a broad array of cultural areas and issues in order to help them understand the important role of their faith in developing a discerning response to culture. Students will attend a variety of events and lectures and be challenged to reflect critically upon their messages, particularly in light of their broader liberal education and their developing understanding of the Christian faith. This course is limited to students in the Honors College.

Learning Outcomes

Through their completion of course requirements, students should gain the following:

- A basic conversancy with a variety of prominent issues in contemporary society and culture.
- An appreciation for the complex nature of contemporary issues and problems.
- The capacity to analyze and contextualize contemporary issues with diligence and honesty.
- The ability to assess contemporary society and culture as faithful participants in the Christian theological tradition.

Requirements

In order to complete HNR 100 A, each student will:

- I. Attend the **Athens & Jerusalem Seminar** on November 10 at 4:00 pm in the Globe Theatre with Dr. Christian Smith, author of What Is a Person?, and moderated by IWU's Dr. Brian Fry. The seminar is offered to students and faculty throughout the university and provides an opportunity for our community to wrestle collectively with a topic related to Christian vocation and scholarship.
 - Optional elective credit: If students would like to read this book and participate in a discussion group, they should select elective 24 when they reserve their elective events (one elective credit). A free copy of the book will be provided.
- 2. Participate in the **President's Author Series** with Dr. Miroslav Volf, author of *Allah*: A *Christian Response*. Participation is three-pronged:
 - Students will read Dr. Volf's book and participate in one 60-minute discussion section with Dr. Riggs. You will be able to attend a discussion either on Tuesday, November 16, or Wednesday, November 17, both from 8:30-9:30 pm in Goodman 201. Watch for an email from honors.office@indwes.edu to sign up for the section that fits your schedule.
 - Students will complete brief reading notes (2-3 typed pages) on Dr. Volf's book and submit 3-4 questions they might ask at the event. The report is due on November 16 at 8:00 pm.
 - Students will attend the President's Author Series event on December 3 from 5:30-8:30 pm in Henry West Banquet Room and the PPAC Auditorium and come prepared to ask questions of the author about the book.
- 3. Complete at least six credits of elective events (see list of elective events, starting on page 4).

Required Reading

The required reading must be completed before the two President's Author Series discussion groups meet:

Volf, Miroslav. (2011). Allah: A Christian Response. This book will not be published until February 2011, but reading copies will be made available.

Participation and Attendance Policies

Athens & Jerusalem Seminar and the President's Author Series: Full participation in these events is mandatory for all Forum students. If a student cannot attend an event, he or she must send an email to honors.forum@indwes.edu at least two weeks in advance.

Elective Events: Participation in **five elective credits** is required. The credit value of each event is listed on pages 4-6. Students may participate in more than five credits of electives, depending upon availability.

Release Form: A completed release form is required for participation in any off-campus events. The form is available on the website where you reserve events (see the section below for details about event reservation). If you select any off-campus events when you reserve an event for Forum, you must complete the release form and return an original, signed copy to the JWHC Office in Goodman 203. The form must be turned in **at least a week before the event**, or we will give your spot to someone else.

Cancellations: You may cancel your reservation up to two weeks before the date of the event, provided that you have a justifiable reason for cancelling. You may also cancel within the two weeks leading up to the event, but you will be responsible for finding another Honors Forum student to take your place. Exceptions for emergency situations will be made on a case-by-case basis.

How to Reserve and Confirm Elective Events

Reservations: On the left hand side of the JWHC website (jwhc.indwes.edu), select "JWHC Academics", then "Honors Forum," then "Reservation Form." Click on that link, and type in the LIMITED Forum events that you would like to attend this semester. We will confirm all requests via email. All reservations are taken on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are willing to drive the IWU van for any of the off-campus events, please let us know in the comments box of the reservation form. Drivers will be given first priority. If a driver cannot be found for a certain event, it will be cancelled, and students will be responsible for finding other elective credits. In order to drive for a Forum event, you must be an approved IWU driver. It is an easy process to become one. Email honors.forum@indwes.edu for more information.

First Date to Reserve Events: Reservations for elective events will not be accepted prior to Saturday, September 18, at 1:00 pm. Any reservations made before that time will not be accepted.

Confirmations: In order to receive credit for any elective that you have attended, you must confirm your attendance online. On the left hand side of jwhc.indwes.edu, select "JWHC Academics," then "Honors Forum," then "Confirmation Form." Click on that link, and enter the number for the event that you attended. All confirmations must be made within one week after the date of the event. If you fail to confirm

within one week of the event, you will be required to write a two-page reflection paper before receiving credit for the event.

Attending a "Full" Event: If you would like to attend an event that is already full, you may still attend and receive credit, but must pay your own transportation and event costs. You will be required to provide proof of attendance, so keep your ticket stubs, playbills, etc.

How Will I Know If You Have Received My Confirmation? We use Blackboard to track your Forum elective credits. You many visit Blackboard to find out which events you have confirmed and how many electives you have completed. Please allow about two weeks after submitting your confirmation before you expect to see it posted on Blackboard.
