Strange thing I did as a child: When I was a child was when my brother took me across a busy street, and then he left me there and I didn't know how to get back home.


If I could travel anywhere, it would be: Australia because I would love to see the Great Barrier Reef and take in all of its' beauty! Plus, they have pretty great accents.
