Retention Rates

- Defined as the percentage of bachelors-seeking students who return from one fall term to the next.

Each year the IWU Life Calling and Career office conducts a survey of all bachelor's degree graduates called the First Destination Survey (FDS). These items are key metrics taken from the FDS annual report.

- Excellence Rate = 80%
- Continuing Education Rate = 17%
- Average annual salary = \$45,816
