

I feel that I was lied to by the faculty. I was told that my degree would lead to licensure that now the state is telling me is impossible. I was encouraged by faculty to proceed. I feel that they knew this would be impossible. No one seemed to care or to offer solutions or even help me problem solve how to proceed. Once IWU got my money, I was no longer valuable or important. They no longer answer any emails asking for help. It's very sad and not Christ-like at all.

Yes! More direction with state licensing testing especially if you are graduating during the summer. If I would have waited to apply for testing after graduating during the summer I would have save \$75 and been eligible to take the test sooner. Or if I would have applied for testing through the state I would be elibofor a temporary license until I took the test. There wasn't enough direction. Recommend that grads be invited back to talk to students in their final semester of their internship class.

#### Marion

I cannot complete this survey as the majority of my clinical mental health education was at another institution and I only had a few courses and professors at IWU.

1. Most faculty did not grade papers and give feedback in timely manner. That created great anxiety for future papers. 2. The faculty often seemed so focused on their projects and book writing that they were unavailable to meet the students' needs as they surfaced (missing an opportunity to demonstrate the counseling/care they are attempting to teach). The best example of this was when we had a classmate tragically die. There was no grief work done with us as a cohort, and we needed it. 3. If faculty are going to be hired, they need to theologically agree and teach what IWU believes. Case in point: Human sexuality class. 4. Program advisers need to make sure they know the state licensing requirements.

When completing the program, I did not realize my age would make a difference in finding a position.

I miss my cohort and the chair of the program! Excellent supportive faculty for full time working mom to compete a Master's later in life!

#### Online

The paperwork, especially in the beginning was a nightmare. The entire Practicum/Internship finding site process was also not explained far enough in advance. Classes were great understanding how they worked - not so much.

The two weekend intensives were very important for the connection to the staff, peers, and IWU.

I am appreciative of the program at Indiana Wesleyan. Dr. Osborn (and other faculty) admitted me into the program, knowing that I was still in somewhat early recovery. I will also be appreciative of this! The few reservations I have about the program are due to some organization and miscommunication of program requirements between faculty and students. I also do not feel the MA program adequately prepared me to pursue my Ph.D. I am currently in my second year as a doctorate student in Counselor Education and Supervision at Walden University. There was a significant learning curve that I had to work through (especially in regard to professional writing). I also felt very inadequately prepared to work towards licensure. It was difficult for me because the requirements for licensure in Colorado are much different than the requirements in Indiana. I had to teach myself about the requirements of licensure and very much felt alone in the process. There were several mistakes made along the way, which delayed the process and resulted in frustration. More focus on the licensure process would be helpful to graduate students (or at least pointing them in the right direction), especially for students who live outside of Indiana. I'm glad IWU is working toward CACREP accreditation. I had to take several additional pre-requisite courses at Walden before I could begin my doctoral work. I've also had to take additional steps in order to work towards licensure. A CACREP accreditation would be helpful to the students in the Clinical Addictions Counseling program for many reasons. I know IWU is working toward this, and I believe it will greatly help students when IWU acquires this accreditation.

I still contact Rob Thompson and Erin Davis with professional questions, and they are always willing to connect. I talk to my undergraduate students often about the program.

I had a couple truly awful adjunct rent-a-profs early on, and several instances of lost paperwork on your end, but thankfully they were not retained and the paperwork was finally figure out by my last two semesters. Whenever something needed addressed it was done and done well. My profs for my practicum and internship experiences were stellar. Overall my experience was a great one.
