Eli Lilly Endowment has granted funds to our School Counseling Program for two purposes: We would like to assist Candidates of Color to enter the profession to increase the ethnicity of school counselors in Indiana; We would like to assist candidates who live and work outside the proximity of school counseling training programs to attain their credentials to serve the areas that are underserved in Indiana. In brief, these IWU School Counseling Scholarships and Research Grants are meant to grow the population of Indiana school counselors 1) whose ethnicity is underrepresented in the field and 2) of school counselors in remote areas, over an hours' drive to a School Counseling Training Program. Priority is given to the above, and then to candidates who show leadership, service, goals, faith, and need. Applications are due November 1 for Spring semester and April 1 for Fall semester.

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School Counseling Lilly Scholarship and Research Grant

Lilly Endowment Foundation has supplied funding to increase the opportunity to train diverse students and those who have restrictive access to training programs because of remote locations. To that end, our IWU School Counseling Program may have funding available to those applicants and students through 2021.

Applicants must be an IWU student in School Counseling who is of color and/or lives outside of 60 miles from a School Counseling Training site. Preference will be given to students who exemplify Christian character and demonstrated excellence in their personal, spiritual, and academic endeavors. A recipient must be in need of financial assistance as demonstrated by the financial information obtained by the Director of Financial Aid. The recipient must have maintained a G.P.A. of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

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
