## VICTIM'S RIGHTS

The Victim Advocacy Liaison Program **provides free and confidential information, advocacy and support** to students and employees who may be victims of sexual assault, sexual harassment, abuse or partner violence.

All medical records related to a medical examination are confidential and do not obligate you to pursue a case. However, they are kept on file with the hospital for one year, giving you the option to pursue a case for up to one year after the exam.

## WHAT TO DO AFTER AN ASSAULT

1. Call someone who is trusted and supportive.
2. DO NOT shower, bathe, or change clothes, use the toilet, eat, drink or brush teeth. It may not be pleasant, but it is important to wait, in order to maintain evidence.
3. Seek medical attention; if possible go to a hospital emergency room.
4. Write down as much information about the incident as you can. It is helpful to include as many details as possible.

### PLEASE NOTE:

These steps are VERY important even if you choose not to press charges. Going to the hospital or filing a police report does not mean you have to press charges or proceed any further with the case. However, should you change your mind (even up to one year later), such information and evidence could prove extremely beneficial.

## CONFIDENTIALITY

Indiana Wesleyan University's Victim Advocacy Liaison Program assures confidentiality. Student's names and personal information will be kept confidential unless written permission is received to release the information to a third party or unless one of the following is met:

- Knowledge of suicidal or homicidal thoughts
- Knowledge that child/elder abuse has occurred
- Information court-ordered by a judge
- Threat to the safety of the student/community



**How can informing the school HELP you through this process?**

### CLASS OR ROOM REASSIGNMENT, ETC...

When a student reporting a sexual assault or sexual harassment and the accused attend the same class or reside in close proximity to one another, interim measures may be considered. The university may consider, with input from the reporting individual, altering the housing situation of the reporting or responding party, altering work arrangements for employees, providing campus escorts, and/or other interim measures. Such measures are available regardless of whether a reporting party seeks formal resolution or makes a crime report.

### EDUCATION AND COUNSELING

The University offers educational resources to students, faculty and staff on sexual assault and sexual harassment. In addition, counseling and limited medical treatment are available to students who may have been a victim of sexual misconduct or any other crime.
