First Time Log In Information

To log in to your portal for the first time, use the username and password credentials IWU emailed you shortly after you were accepted. The student portal will become your primary means of communication once you start classes, so be sure to familiarize yourself with it!

CLEARED FOR CLASS

We want to help you take care of business—from your payment plan to housing assignments—before your check-in day so that you can be fully focused on academic learning, enriching relationships, and personal growth when classes begin. All new and returning students are required to be “cleared for class” in order to move into their residence hall, attend New Student Orientation and begin classes. BEFORE CLASSES

TUITION & BILLING



Exceptions apply to the above due dates for pending financial aid, as long as all requested information and/or documents have been submitted. If all requested information and/or documents have not been submitted to the Financial Aid Office by July 31 or Dec. 15, the remaining balance is due immediately.

PLAN ONE

Pay net amount due (total charges, minus any scholarships, grants and/or campus administered loans confirmed by Financial Aid) by **July 31** for the fall semester and by **Dec. 15** for the spring semester.

Online payments may be paid through the student portal by selecting "Pay on My Account" located in student account information. A service fee of 2.45% is applied to all credit/debit card payments. IWU accepts:



E-checks are accepted online free of charge.

PLAN TWO

Pay net amount due using Federal Direct Loan or Parent PLUS Loan. It is recommended that all financial aid processes and paperwork be completed by June 1 to meet the **July 31** payment date for the fall semester (**Dec. 15** for the spring semester).

PLAN THREE

Arrange payment through the Tuition Payment Plan (offered through ACI Payments), an interest-free alternative that spreads payments throughout the course of each semester. A non-refundable \$25 application fee is charged for each semester. Spring tuition payment plans can be arranged at the same time as fall plans. You can enroll in a payment plan by visiting payplan.officialpayments.com.

ACADEMIC FAQ

What can I major in at IWU?

You can choose from more than 80 majors to develop your knowledge and expertise. Our Life Calling team can help you identify your strengths and learn how to best use them. Visit indwes.edu/majors for the list of majors.

How do I make sure I receive my earned Advanced Placement (AP) credit?

Please have your AP scores sent directly from College Board to IWU. If you have taken an AP course that is on the approved list and you received the score required, Registration and Academic Services will apply the qualifying credits and equivalencies to your record.

Do I have an academic advisor?

Yes! You will have a Faculty Advisor from your academic division. Additionally, you will have a First-Year Advisor who can help you navigate through your first year at IWU. You can locate your advisors' names on the first page of your degree audit.

How do I change my schedule?

Prior to your arrival on campus, you can make adjustments to your schedule via e-mail. Contact Registration and Academic Services at RAS@indwes.edu or reach out to your First-Year Advisor.

Once you arrive on campus, you will start the process of dropping and/or adding a class by speaking with your advisor. He or she will assist you in making the change online.

Can my parents see my grades?

INFORMATION RELEASE

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) protects the privacy of students' education records once they reach the age of 18 or attend a postsecondary institution. This law protects the rights of students to review their own records and to challenge any content of the record.

To grant someone else access to your records, simply fill out the information release located in self-service. This form is located on the left side of the page under Academics and is titled Release Information. For a direct link, simply use ferpa.dwa.indwes.edu.

Make sure the persons listed have your password. For FERPA questions, contact the University Registrar's Office at registrar@indwes.edu.

If you wish to grant someone else access to your records, we recommend doing this by Sept. 1.

CAMPUS LIVING FAQ

When will I get my housing and roommate assignment?

Once you have completed your fall housing application, registered for classes, and paid your deposit, we will begin assigning students on June 1 for our first round of housing. The second round of housing will take place June 20.

What amenities are available in my residence hall?

What furniture will be provided in my room?

- One dresser to be shared with roommate
- Wall storage units

Are there laundry facilities?

Yes, free laundry facilities are available for use in each living area.

Are there times during the year when all students must leave the residence halls?

Yes, all halls are closed over Thanksgiving, Christmas and Spring breaks.

Can I commute to campus?

If you are planning to commute to campus, and if you qualify, you must fill out an Off-Campus Application form at housing.indwes.edu. Once you are approved, you won't need to apply in future semesters.

What should I pack?

CAMPUS SAFETY

IWU maintains a police department for the safety and security of the campus. All officers employed by IWU Campus Police meet the standards established by the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy. IWU police offers work part time for IWU while working as full-time officers with the Grant County Sheriff's Office and Marion Police Department. Officers have graduated from the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy.

PARKING INFORMATION

All students may park on campus. Vehicles parked on campus are required to have a valid permit affixed to the vehicle. IWU has specified parking locations for students and employees. Parking permits are \$50 each year. To register online, visit the Campus Police page on the IWU student portal. After registration is complete, pick up your permit, map and parking policies from the Office of Campus Police located in the Student Center, Suite 148. **The permit fee is automatically billed to your student account and does not have to be paid prior to picking up your permit.**

RAVE ALERT

Rave Alert is an electronic notification system for the IWU community. The system sends mass notification alerts via text and/or email to registered members in an emergency such as severe weather. All students are automatically enrolled in the alert notification system with information submitted on their application. Once registered, students will have the option to edit their contact information.

Safe Ride is operated by Campus Police student security officers. Hours of operation are 7:00 p.m.-12:30 a.m. everyday.

The IWU Campus Store provides IWU apparel and gifts in addition to course materials and school supplies. When purchasing course materials, you will have the choice of new, used, or rental. Rental options are the most cost effective, and you can always choose to keep a rental later.

SLINGSHOT

Slingshot is a service designed to help streamline the start of your college career by packaging all required course materials and delivering them directly to your residence hall before classes start. Materials for commuter students will be waiting to be picked up at the IWU Post Office. Your course materials are then charged to your student account.

VARSITY ATHLETES AND NURSING STUDENTS

In addition to the required health information for IWU that are submitted through Med+Proctor, varsity athletes and nursing students are required to have a physical. Varsity athletes will submit documentation as directed by their team athletic trainer and coach. Nursing students should submit documentation to the Nursing Clinical Placement Coordinator.

WILDCAT HEALTH CLINIC

WE'RE HERE FOR YOU

Knowing where to go and who to talk to is an important first step to make your experience at IWU as rewarding as possible. There is an extensive network of people preparing for your arrival.

Your Resident Assistant (RA) is a student just like you who lives on your floor and has been selected and trained to assist and support you. He or she helps students get acquainted, offers a listening ear and ensures University policies are followed.

Your Resident Director (RD) oversees the administration and activities of your hall and supervises the RA staff. Your RD is a full-time staff member of the University and lives in your building.

Assistant Resident Director runs all operations at the front desk and helps plan events for the residents in your hall to get together, learn and have fun.

Your Resident Spiritual Life Coordinator facilitates small groups and other facets of communal spirituality in each hall, serving as a connection to the Chapel Office and many other spiritual formation spaces.

The Front Desk Workers are here to assist and greet you! Come to the desk in your residence hall for snacks, cleaning supplies, toilet paper or just to say hello.

Your Peer Educator is an upper-division student dedicated to helping you navigate your transition to college through your First Year Experience (FYE) course.
