III.	Club Policies and Procedures				

- <u>ALL</u> Club members must have a signed Assumption of Risk and Release of Liability Form ("Release")
 on file in the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics before access will be granted to the University's
 athletic facilities. Minors who are part of a Family Club Membership must have a Release on file that
 is signed by their parent or guardian.
- 2. Club memberships are for the period September 1 to August 31.
- 3. Membership fees must be paid in full upon application acceptance.

- 4. Membership fees are prorated for applications accepted after January 1.
- 5. Club memberships are not eligible for gift receipts.
- All Club members must follow the University's Recreation and Wellness Center's ("RWC") published rules and guidelines.
- 7. All members must keep RWC facilities and equipment neat and clean.
- 8. The RWC is subject to the University's academic calendar and, therefore, its hours of operation may be limited during holidays and over school breaks.
- 9. Members must sign in and present their membership card at the front desk of the RWC each time they use the facility.
- 10. Personal locks are not permitted in RWC locker rooms. Any personal locks found will be cut off and the belongings in the locker will be stored for thirty (30) days. After thirty (30) days, unclaimed belongings will be donated to charity.
- 11. RWC locks can be rented for \$5.00 from the front desk. The \$5.00 deposit will be refunded upon return of the lock.
- 12. Annually in April, all lockers will be tagged. Please return this tag from your locker to the front desk worker to continue the use of your lock and locker. Any locker whose tag has not been returned will be emptied, and the belongings in the locker will be stored for thirty (30) days. After thirty (30) days, unclaimed belongings will be donated to charity.
- 13. The University's RWC is not a fitness club. Its mission and priority is to first serve University students, faculty, staff and administration. Club Membership is a privilege and courtesy to our alumni and community friends.

IV. Indiana Wesleyan University Community Lifestyle Standards

Indiana Wesleyan University, as a Wesleyan Christian College, is a community joined together to further academic achievement, personal development and spiritual growth. Together the community seeks to honor Christ by integrating faith, learning, and living while its member's hearts and lives mature in relationship to Jesus Christ and each other.

Participating in a community with others is a sacred privilege and a demonstration of God's grace. We, therefore, place great value on the quality of relationships in our community. This quality is emulated by the following relationship characteristics: being dependent and accountable to one another; serving one another in the Community, nation, and world; supporting one another, especially those experiencing personal trials; resolving problems through loving confrontation, and restoring relationships that have been hurt.

Faith in God's Word should lead to behavior displaying His authority in our lives. The following statements exhibit our continuing desire to integrate faith and action in a relevant manner. Although these positions are not set forth as the sole index of Christianity, they do represent expectations of compliance to behaviors and community expectations that members of our facility clubs need to agree to follow. This allows club members to align themselves with the overall community at IWU.

Scripture teaches that certain attributes such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are to be manifested by members of the Christian Community. By contrast, Scripture condemns such attitudes as greed, jealousy, pride, lust, needless anger, an unforgiving spirit, harmful discrimination, and prejudice. Furthermore, certain behaviors are expressly prohibited by Scripture. These include theft, lying, dishonestly, gossip, slander, profanity, vulgarity, adultery, homosexual behavior, premarital sex, drunkenness, immodesty, and occult practices.

Scripture teaches that our actions (work, study, play) should be performed to the glory of God. We endeavor, therefore, to be selective in choices of entertainment and recreation, promoting those which strengthen the body of Christ and avoiding those which would diminish sensitivity to Christian responsibility. In violation of the scriptural teaching concerning personal dignity and moral purity, individuals are exploited and degraded by immoral and inhumane action of the pornographic industry. Therefore, possession of such materials is unacceptable behavior.

Since the body of the Christian is the temple of the Holy Spirit, deserving respect and preservation of its well being, we therefore disapprove of the use of tobacco in any form and the use of alcoholic beverages. Under no circumstances should controlled substances such as marijuana, hallucinogens, depressants, stimulants, cocaine, and narcotics be used, possessed, sold, or distributed on or away form campus unless prescribed by a physician. Members are expected not to abuse the use of legal substances.
